Where Are You?

Then the Lord God called to the man, "Where are you?" GENESIS 3:9 NLT

"Where could she be?" they playfully wonder aloud. The period of life when we believe we can hide in plain sight is brief, and full of discovery.

ROMANS 13:8 NIV

However, the Bible instructs us to treat love as debt, in the sense that we should continually be compelled to love one another and to give love even if it has not been earned! This is the extreme love that God has shown us. Let his unending and unconditional love for you be the reminder letter that you need to spur you on to love others in the same way.

We are boldly called to do something that is entirely unnatural. Cast our anxieties on the Lord? What a word! Have you ever been anxious? Have you ever been paralyzed with fear? What should we do as God's children? His advice is simple. Cast it to him.

Casting means to throw out aggressively. Sometimes we habitually turn into anxious people, facing every trial with fear and not our promised peace. In training yourself to be a "caster" of anxiety and not a holder of it, you will enjoy abundant freedom that you had previously only wished for.

Father, give me the grace to break the habit of anxiety and help me learn to enjoy the freedom you died for me to have.



I sought the Lord, and he answered me and delivered me from all my fears. PSALM 34:4 FSV

For various reasons, many of us grow up with certain fears in our hearts. Often the fear is unwarranted, but sometimes it's based on tragic circumstances. When fear's seeds sink into our hearts, they can grow giant trees of debilitating behaviors that paralyze us from functioning normally.

Praise the Lord that we have an advocate who has the power to demolish every stronghold and fear that has ever gripped us. The simple formula to access the power of our deliverer is to seek him. True Strength

ROMANS 5:3 NLT

There is one trick—don't give up. Don't plan to reap something that you just started sowing. Maybe you will see fruit immediately from the good seeds you planted, but in most cases, it takes years. Rest assured, you will eventually reap the seeds of goodness if you don't give up.

Lord, help me not grow weary in doing good. Give me long term vision that doesn't get discouraged in short term losses.

Blackbird Bluff

Stay alert! Watch out for your great enemy, the devil. He prowls around like a roaring lion, looking for someone to devour. Stand firm against him, and be strong in your faith.

1 PETER 5:8-9 NIT

In the parking lot of a lovely little park, a sleek blackbird demanded attention. He was busy pecking at a small wad of bread, surely enjoying an unexpected treat. A much larger blackbird circled him menacingly—moving in closer, then hopping back. You could almost hear his bird voice squawking, "Drop it buddy, and I mean now!" The smaller bird seemed completely oblivious. He was not in the least frightened, and he continued to enjoy his dinner. After a moment, the bully bird backed off. He was suddenly the same size as the other bird. He had puffed his feathers out in an attempt to

look big and scary. The smaller bird knew he was a phony and paid him no mind.

The Bible describes our enemy, Satan, as a roaring lion, prowling around looking for someone to devour. A lion that roars is not to be feared because he has given his presence away, allowing his prey time to escape. When we are in tune with God, we don't need to fear Satan's tactics. We will hear the roar a mile away and take appropriate action to see to his defeat. Satan's roar is not to be feared because compared to God he is all blackbird bluff. Let's pay him no mind!

Lord, give me discernment so that I can recognize the enemy's tactics and lies.

Thank you for giving me the victory as I take my stand against his wiles.

Bridging the Gap

Faith is the confidence that what we hope for will actually happen; it gives us assurance about things we cannot see.

They fluctuate depending on our circumstances, much as our moods change with the weather. The good news is that they don't change facts! God promises strength, wisdom, peace, hope, direction, comfort, forgiveness, courage,

eternal life, and so much more. These are unchangeable—they are written in stone.

How do we move from the tyranny of emotions to the confidence of faith? We must determine to believe what God says instead of what our emotions say, and then declare his promises aloud! Then we do it again and again and again until faith rises and bridges the gap.

Lord, your Word is true and I know it. Right now, I feel so alone and frightened even though I know you promise never to leave me or forsake me.

I choose to believe the truth. Help me now by the power of your Spirit.

But Dust

For He Himself knows our frame; He is mindful that we are but dust.

You, Lord, are our Father.

ISAIAH 64:8 NIV

There are many types of pottery—from basic earthenware used for mundane tasks to lovely, decorative pieces that adorn someone's mantelpiece. It is interesting to note that God uses this imagery all the way from Genesis to Revelation. He is the artist (potter); we are the clay. The potter has absolute power to create exactly according to his wish; the pot has no say.

Eat for Life

Man does not live by bread alone, but man lives by everything that proceeds out of the mouth of the Lord.

DEUTERONOMY 8:3 NASB

It isn't often that we err on the side of eating too little! Hunger pangs, boredom, anxiety, even depression can propel us to the refrigerator! There is one kind of food that we can ingest without restraint—the meat of the Word.

The Scriptures are our spiritual food: a veritable banquet laid out for our

enjoyment. The Word will nourish, guide, comfort, convict, keep us from sinning, and satisfy every hungry, thirsty soul. Read it and remember that as one weakens physically without regular meals, so the soul will become impoverished without habitual intake of the Word. Eat for life!

In our spiritual lives we need tools as well. God never intended us to struggle along without the necessary instruments for success. Scripture, breathed by God,

Sometimes the youthful prefer to learn from their peer group, viewing the elders as somewhat outdated. Conversely, the older woman may feel disconnected and extinct herself. Let's overcome these hindrances and be women who are willing to teach and willing to learn!

Lord, help me to be willing to heed your instruction. I have much to give and much to learn from my sisters in Christ. Give me an opportunity today to put your Word into action!

If the church is to grow and be edified, then selfishness can have no place in it. Each time we use our own gifts to better others, we are retelling the gospel with our lives.

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Kope of Glory

God decided to let his people know this rich and glorious secret which he has for all people.

This secret is Christ himself, who is in you. He is our only hope for glory.

COLOSSIANS 1:27 NCV

Let's take a moment to contemplate true strength. Your body may feel weak to you on a day-to-day basis. But, if you are a child of God, you are not the only one indwelling your body. Christ is in you, and *that* is the hope of glory.

To walk in the knowledge and peace that Christ is in you, by his spirit, is abiding in a place of enormous strength. We know that Jesus is greater than anything and anyone. Acknowledge the powerful truth that if you are born again, Christ is dwelling in you. The same power that raised Jesus from the dead also rests in you—and that will be the power that raises you with him on the day he calls you to your eternal home. Indeed, this is the hope of glory.

Stubborn people with unrepentant hearts actually store up wrath. This shouldn't scare believers because they have approached God already in humility and repentance. For believers there is much better news: they are storing up rewards. Let's store up treasures that won't rust—to be enjoyed for all eternity.

No Longer Infants

This work must continue until we are all joined together in the same faith and in the same knowledge of the Son of God. We must become like a mature person, growing until we become like Christ and have his perfection.

EPHESIANS 4:13 NCV

When we first come to Christ, we are babies in the faith—regardless of our actual age. As God begins his work of making us like him, he feeds us gentle baby food. While infants are adorable, they aren't meant to stay that way. God matures us by his Spirit, feeding us food that we have to chew. This food is meaty and it satisfying but we have to process it.

The passage in Ephesians 4 refers to our maturing through solid teaching of the Word of God. Many teachings of Jesus are simple to hear but hard to do. A mature child of God can receive and do what God asks without being offended. Infants aren't mature or grounded in the Word. They are susceptible to being tossed back and forth by poor teaching. Praise God that it is his work to mature us!

Mind Control

If people's thinking is controlled by the sinful self, there is death.

But if their thinking is controlled by the Spirit, there is life and peace.

ROMANS 8:6 NCV

Our minds are a powerful tool. No action takes place, whether good or bad, without starting first as a thought in the mind. Your mind dictates your entire body. What you give your thoughts to has direct implications on the actions you take. God calls us to be transformed by first renewing our minds so we will rightly discern his will.

But controlling and renewing our minds isn't natural to us. Often we feel helpless

or subject to the thoughts that come through our brains, and we find ourselves entertaining them without even being conscious we are doing so. That is why God has given us the most necessary and precious gift—his Spirit. Apart from his Spirit, we are powerless to steward our thoughts well. When his Spirit controls our thoughts, we'll find that our minds move from anxiety, fear, and death to life and peace.

Jesus, please fill me with your Spirit. I submit my mind to you today and ask you to control it so that my thoughts become those of life and peace.

Separated from His Love

Know therefore that the Lord your God is God; he is the faithful God, keeping his covenant of love to a thousand generations of those who love him and keep his commandments.

Has someone ceased to love you? What was the offense that put their love over the edge? Too many infractions? Too much broken trust? Your apology did not seem sincere? Maybe you have ceased to love someone. Human love is frail. This is why it is all the more critical not to put human attributes on God. His love is nothing like ours.

Enjoy your Father's steadfast love today. His love is incapable of failing you because nothing has the power to separate you from it. Don't berate yourself for your fickle love; be strengthened in his unfailing love.

Thank you, Lord, that your love is incapable of failing and I cannot be separated from it.						

Gift of Weakness

When Uzziah became powerful, his pride led to his ruin. He was unfaithful to the Lord his God.

King Uzziah became King of Judah when he was 16 years old. 2 Chronicles 26 speaks highly of him as he began his young reign as king. He did what was right in the eyes of the Lord and as long as he sought the Lord, God gave him success. But something changed part way through his reign. His strength actually became his weakness. It led to pride and his ultimate destruction.

Have you ever considered that your weaknesses might be gifts from God? They might be what forces you into humility because you know that you aren't perfect and are always in need of a savior. God resists the proud, but the humble in heart can draw near to him. Which are you?

Father, thank you that you give grace to the humble. Thank you for my weaknesses that allow me cling even more closely to your precious cross. Help me to embrace humility and draw nearer to you				

Talking Back

Who indeed are you, a human being, to argue with God?
Will what is molded say to the one who molds it, "Why have you made me like this?"

ROMANS 9:20 NRSV

Have you ever found yourself talking back to God? We do so when we think we know better, or when we think we see more clearly. We sometimes think our earthly wisdom exceeds that of our maker. We might talk back when we are sincerely hurting over tough—and sometimes tragic—circumstances.

It's not that God isn't thick-skinned enough to handle our questions. They don't rattle him or make him insecure. But often they don't help us an ounce. Spiritual maturity shows when you can whole-heartedly acknowledge to God that you don't understand but you still trust him. He is love. Everything he does is love. You can count on that.

Have you been in a spiritual storm?

God isn't being cruel to Job in his questioning. He is helping Job see that God is much bigger. Discipline as a Gift

No discipline seems pleasant at the time, but painful. Later on, however, it produces a harvest of righteousness and peace for those who have been trained by it.

HEBREWS 12:11 NIV

We all appreciate well-disciplined children. Children that have learned, at some point, that they must submit to their parents are a delight to be around. While they are still fully children, they exhibit a humility that submits to rules and authority—even when they don't like it.

As children of God, we can also take comfort when he disciplines us. The

heart of God in disciplining us is clearly that he does it in love, for our benefit. He is serious about dealing with sin in our hearts, and this will naturally be painful. But we should be encouraged; if we submit to the discipline of God in our lives, he gives us a precious gift—a harvest of righteousness and peace. Who doesn't want a more peaceful heart?

Lord, help me embrace your discipline.

Train me by it so that a harvest of righteousness is produced in my heart.

Running Unhindered

Since we are surrounded by such a great cloud of witnesses, let us throw off everything that hinders and the sin that so easily entangles.

And let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us.

Have you ever watched a runner hindered by added baggage? In the Olympics, do you see runners racing with a backpack on their back? Hiking boots, jeans, coats, or sweatshirts? No. Trained runners run as leanly as they can. They wear aerodynamic shoes, sleeveless shirts, and thinly weighted shorts. Their goal is to not be hindered by anything so they might run the best possible race.

The author of Hebrews correlates our Christian pilgrimage to that of a runner in a race. We have the power to make our run much easier. The Holy Spirit is excellent at specifically showing us what is hindering us. We weren't designed to run a sluggish race—sin and disobedience cause that. Through the Spirit's power, you can throw off *anything* that hinders you and run.

Father, give me the grace and strength to cast off sin, so I can run my race in the best possible form.				

God Loves Justice

Now let the fear of the Lord be upon you. Judge carefully, for with the Lord our God there is no injustice or partiality or bribery.

2 CHRONICLES 19:7 NIV

God had set up a system for Israel and Judah to manage themselves as a nation. Part of that system included setting apart judges who would rightly and wisely rule when there was a dispute. His call to the appointed judges was powerful. For a nation that was created to represent and be a blessing to the world, it was really important for them to have just judges. They represented God.

Do you long for justice in a specific area of your life? How about for the countless disenfranchised victims in the world? You must know that your passion for justice comes from God's heart. Not everything looks fair and equitable right now. But this isn't the end. Your just Judge will judge the world rightly when all is said and done. Even more mind-blowing is that he already judged us by pouring his wrath on Jesus on the cross, so none would have to pay the ultimate price for our sin.

Thank you, God, that you love justice. Thank you, Jesus, that you suffered on my behalf so I don't have to suffer the full weight of my sin. Your love is truly perfect and I am deeply grateful.

Stored Goodness

How abundant are the good things that you have stored up for those who fear you, that you bestow in the sight of all, on those who take refuge in you.

PSALM 31:19 NIV

David, who enjoyed a great friendship with God, makes many wonderfully startling claims about God. God is storing up goodness! What exactly is that goodness? Is it safety and security? Is it peace in trials? Is it a quiet heart in the middle of a storm? Is it joy in the midst of mourning? Yes, it would seem that his goodness could be all of these and much more.

There is so much goodness that God actually has to store it, so he doesn't drench us in it all at once. But there is a caveat. The goodness referenced in this passage is reserved for a special group of people—those who fear God. It is for those who humbly come to him because he is the King and they are not. Rest assured, God will reward you more than your wildest dreams for loving him like that.

Help me, Jesus, to trust in God's goodness like you did when you were on the earth. Thank you that you see my faith even when it's weak, and you store up goodness for me.

Pearn from Me

"Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest." MATTHEW 11:28 NIV

Perhaps it's morning when you are reading this. Your day is just beginning, yet your heart is already heavy. Or maybe it's the end of the day and you feel weakened by the burdens you have taken on. Rest in the kindest person there ever was. Let his words soothe and strengthen you.

Perhaps you have taken on more than what God is asking you to—physically

or emotionally. Christ himself makes it clear that his yoke is easy and his burden is light. If your yoke is too heavy, perhaps you aren't supposed to be carrying it in the first place. Learn from Jesus. Refusing wrong yokes won't necessarily feel natural to you. But ask and learn. As you do, he will strengthen your ability to know the difference, so you might enjoy his rest.

Jesus, help me learn from you and rest in you. I don't want to carry any yokes that you aren't asking me to. Give me wisdom and discernment as I walk into each new day.						aren't

JOHN 15:15 NIV

Pharisees knew the Law but rarely knew the spirit of the Law. There are many issues where they were passionate about obeying the Law, but their hearts were far from God. This is a dangerous place to be. God is far more interested in a humble and a contrite heart than cold-hearted obedience to his Law with a bitter spirit.

Have you ever found yourself obeying the commands of God but with a heart that was far from his? Be careful of this tendency. We can sometimes be rule-keepers without walking in deep friendship with God. God is not just looking for a servant; he is looking for a friend. Servants obey because they have to. Friends walk in close relationship because they understand shared love.

Holy Spirit, only you can reveal Jesus to me and help me see him in his humility and love.

I pray that you would help me to obey the Father not out of duty but out of love.

Ask, Seek, Knock

"Ask and it will be given to you; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you.

For everyone who asks receives; the one who seeks finds; and to the one who knocks,

the door will be opened."

MATTHEW 7:7-8 NIV

Has your faith gotten weaker over time? Have some of your harder experiences left your more faithless than hopeful? Remember, regardless of the degree of your hard experiences, he promises to work everything out for good in your heart and life. Don't let your

disappointments cloud the truth of God's Word. He promises that everyone who asks in his name receives.

Are you asking? Then you can count on receiving. Are you seeking? He promises you will find. Are you knocking? Yes, child, the door will be opened to you.

Father, please refresh me by the truth of your Word. Help me to believe you again and with faith ask, seek, and knock.

Calling and Selection

Be all the more diligent to make certain about His calling and choosing you; for as long as you practice these things, you will never stumble; for in this way the entrance into the eternal kingdom of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ will be abundantly supplied to you.

Peter had just shared a crucial piece of wisdom for believers: when you have faith, be good. When you are good, be knowledgeable. When you are knowledgeable, be self-disciplined. When you are self-disciplined, become tenacious. When you are tenacious, become godly. When you are godly, become warm-hearted toward each other. When you are warm-hearted, become a lover. What a list!

Why did Peter continue to warn us that we should ensure we are called and chosen? Because to require a journey from faith to love is impossible, but to live and dwell in Christ makes for a fully satisfying, joy-filled journey. When you stumble, Jesus helps you up. When you are weak, he is strong. Assess your heart, and trust Jesus to it. Choose his blood for your power, grace, and mercy, and his presence as your constant companion. Stay in the journey fully dependent upon Jesus and all he is.

Jesus, I choose you!

Growing in Discernment

See to it that no one takes you captive through philosophy and empty deception, according to the tradition of men, according to the elementary principles of the world, rather than according to Christ.

COLOSSIANS 2:8 NASB

The simplicity of the gospel can be offensive. This is because it relies solely on Jesus' complete work on the cross and not on our own merit. We are saved purely by receiving Christ's payment for our sins. He was able to pay for them fully because he provided a perfect sacrifice for the sins of all of mankind.

There are many false teachings that will try to lead you away from simple faith and trust in God's ability to save you. The responsibility to discern and not be taken captive by false teachings is on us. We have be rooted and grounded in the teachings of Jesus so that we can discern the difference between false teaching and the teachings of God. Let us build our faith wholly on Christ.

Continue to repent and submit yourself to God. He is more passionate about renewing you than you are. He's a loving God who is committed to the process.

God, I'm sorry for all the times I fall short. Help me to continually seek to renew my heart and my mind. Show me how to become more like you.				

Content in All Situations

I have learned how to be content with whatever I have. PHILIPPIANS 4:11 NLT

What an incredible gift Paul walked in. He knew how to be content regardless of how much or how little he had. It's interesting too that, as a believer, both situations arose in his life. There were times he had plenty and times he didn't. Did that mean God wasn't blessing him when he lacked? No, it simply meant those were the circumstances he found himself in. But you hear no accusatory overtone in Paul's writing here. He is not angry at God. He simply understood that

following God would, or could, mean times of plenty and times of scarcity.

The secret to contentment is realizing that our circumstances don't determine our peace. We might be suffering or we might be on a mountaintop of victory, but our peace and our steadfast walk with God remain the same either way. Our joy is not contingent on our circumstance. Rather, we are satisfied that God will give us what we need when we need it.

God, I trust that you know exactly what I need. You are a faithful provider and I thank you for the many blessings you have bestowed on me. I choose to be grateful for the times of plenty and the times of want. Help me to be equally content in both situations.

Standing Blameless

To Him who is able to keep you from stumbling, and to make you stand in the presence of His glory blameless with great joy.

Have you ever noticed what people did in Scripture when they were in the presence of an angel? Often they fell down, or they were so taken aback by the angel's presence that they had to be told not to fear. If that is what people do when they see angels, how do you suppose we will react upon seeing God himself? God calls us to stand before him. How will we even breathe?

Beloved, that we can stand blameless with great joy is an amazing truth that should cause us to arise with tears of gratitude. God does this for us because he no longer counts our sins against us. He has judged his Son in our place and has given us his Son's righteousness. We are blameless in his presence not because we don't sin, but because Jesus has paid for our sins.

Thank you, God, that you alone will cause me to stand in your presence perfectly blamele. Thank you for receiving me and calling me your own.				

Confident Approach

Let us then approach God's throne of grace with confidence, so that we may receive mercy and find grace to help us in our time of need.

HEBREWS 4:16 NIV

Children were given parents so their basic needs could be met. It is a parent's job to provide food, shelter, and clothing. Instead, he was giving all his energy to communing with the Father and being strengthened by their relationship. At the end of that time, Satan came to tempt him. Jesus withstood authentic temptation and never gave in.

It's interesting how God prepared Jesus for this trial. He didn't have him attend

a conference, read a self-help book, or have a healing service. Instead, he led his son to be physically weaker so he could lean fully on the Father. Jesus had been on a 40-day diet of love, affirmation, and encouragement. He wasn't weakened by his lack of food. In fact, he made it clear that food alone wasn't what made a child of God strong. Perhaps that's one of the greatest gifts in fasting—we are able to see that it isn't food that sustains us but God's power in us.

Father, thank you that we don't live on bread alone. Help us eat what we need to be strong in you: every Word that comes from your mouth.

The First Move

We love because he first loved us.

Before Jesus began his earthly ministry, he was baptized by John the Baptist. John's job had been to prepare the way. Before Jesus was even on the public scene, he was calling people to repent.
